Strengths

- Ability to levy taxes
- Can create hard restrictions
- Can do a combination of both
- Can incentivize innovation through grants, rewards for hitting targets, etc.
- Easy access to debt (especially cheap in the United States)
- Collaboration between experts and policymakers

- Consistent lobbying for established interests
- People who don't recognize reality have disproportionate voting power

Strengths

- Rapid, decisive
- Effective
- Regulation based on legislative framework (EPA)
- High focus on expertise- knowledgeable individuals have more power

- Easily undone with each administration
- Legislation removed of democratic process

Strengths

• System fully looks at both sides of a case

- Decisions are based on precedent set well before challenges came to the forefront
- Naturally slow
- Restitution for individuals regarding environmental harm is hard to get

Strengths

- Can create laws against discrimination in certain areas
- Can enforce income redistribution, such as reparations, through taxation

- "Tyranny of the majority"
- Difficult to protect minorities
- In the US, the white Republican voting bloc is overrepresented
